- The boiling point of water is 100 degrees Celsius, **so** we boiled the beaker to that temperature.

JOINING IDEAS WITH SUBORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS:

Each of these words may be used to combine two or more clauses, one independent the other dependent.

- As long as it keeps snowing, the city will have to clear the snow.
- We will arrive in Madrid on Thursday **provided that** we catch the 9 p.m. plane.

Although Since Because After Until Wherever If

Different words may be used to accomplish specific tasks.

EXPLAIN A CAUSE OR REASON:

due to ... if ... as because

so that because ...

since ...

CONTRAST IDEAS:

although whereas despite even though though

unless

IDENTIFY A PLACE:

where wherever

DESCRIBE THE TIMING OF AN EVENT:

when as soon as... since whenever before until while after once...

DESCRIBE A CONDITION:

as long as in case only if unless

even if provided that

JOINING IDEAS WITH ADVERBIAL CONJUNCTIONS:

Each of these words may be used to connect and transition between two independent clauses.

- I am driving across Canada; eventually, I will reach Vancouver.
- She arrived at the recital. She was, **however**, very late.
- She was disappointed because her brother arrived late. Also, her brother lost the gift he was supposed to bring.

JOINING IDEAS WITH ADVERBIAL CONJUNCTIONS (CONT'D):

PRESENT AN ALTERNATIVE VIEW:

on the contrary in spite of on the other hand in fact instead regardless

otherwise

ADD A POINT:

moreover but also in addition besides additionally again not only ... furthermore and then ...

also and

PLACE EMPHASIS:

certainly in fact undoubtedly of course

indeed

GIVE AN EXAMPLE:

for example for instance indeed specifically namely in particular in other words that is to explain such as

ADD DETAIL:

also specifically moreover in other words besides to elaborate

furthermore

PRESENT A RESULT:

thus accordingly therefore hence consequently as a result

PROVIDE EVIDENCE:

[this] shows that [this] proves that [this] suggests that one may deduce that

CONCEDE A POINT

granted at the same time albeit of course after all naturally

QUALIFY AN ARGUMENT:

possibly maybe probably actually perhaps

GENERALIZE:

usually always most often never constantly in general

rarely

PRESENT IDEAS IN **ORDER OF IMPORTANCE:**

most importantly least importantly

CONCLUDE OR SUMMARIZE:

in brief to conclude in short finally in summary on the whole in conclusion to sum

COMPARE IDEAS:

DESCRIBE THE TIMING OF AN EVENT:

in a like manner similarly first, second ... usually frequently in the past on the one hand likewise next again after seldom subsequently soon shortly later on **CONTRAST IDEAS:** previously then lately eventually

however nonetheless nevertheless still

meanwhile while it happened sometimes finally

shortly lately
