How to create and edit automatically generated citations from different databases

HOW TO EDIT AUTOMATICALLY GENERATED CITATIONS:

Automatic citation tools can be useful to acquire referencing information **fast**. However, they often return entries with **errors** in them.

For example, the article database Academic Search Complete returned the following MLA citation.

- Most of this particular entry is correct. However, the name of the vendor (EBSCOhost) should be replaced with the database (Academic Search Complete).
- Make sure the entry in your Works Cited is in 12-point, Times New Roman font and doublespaced with a hanging indent, as shown below.

- Edit the capitalization, italics, order of elements, and punctuation if necessary.
- Always put the DOI instead of an URL or a permalink when a DOI is available. (In this instance, there is no DOI.)
