What's the SIN Exam?

The University of Waterloo Physics Department gives several Sir Isaac Newton (SIN) Awards each year to students proceeding towards an Honours Physics degree in either Regular or Co-operative Applied Physics based on the results of SIN exam competition.

What are the prizes?

Several Entrance Scholarships up to \$1,000 are awarded to Waterloo's incoming Physics students. Book prizes are also given to the top 100+ students.

Additionally, among the participating Dawson students only, a \$100 first prize will be awarded along with books for the second and third place finishers.

What else should I know about the SIN exam?

Each year more than 5000 students across Canada take part in the SIN Exam. It is meant to challenge participants to apply basic physics in problem situations. Few perfect papers are written and the "raw average score" is typically 15-20%. While challenging, there are always interesting and amusing problems in the SIN exam. Note that the results are never seen by any admission people and cannot count against a student in any way. A student has nothing to lose by taking the exam. For more information visit:
