English and French Placement Tests

As part of the DEC requirements from the Ministry of Higher Education, all students must successfully complete Ministerial English and French courses.

Students who have graduated from a Quebec high school or Quebec adult education centre **and** have taken their Secondary V Ministerial Exams in English and French in the last three years do **not** write placement tests.

If you have not graduated from a Quebec high school or Quebec adult education centre, you **must** write English and French Placement Tests.
