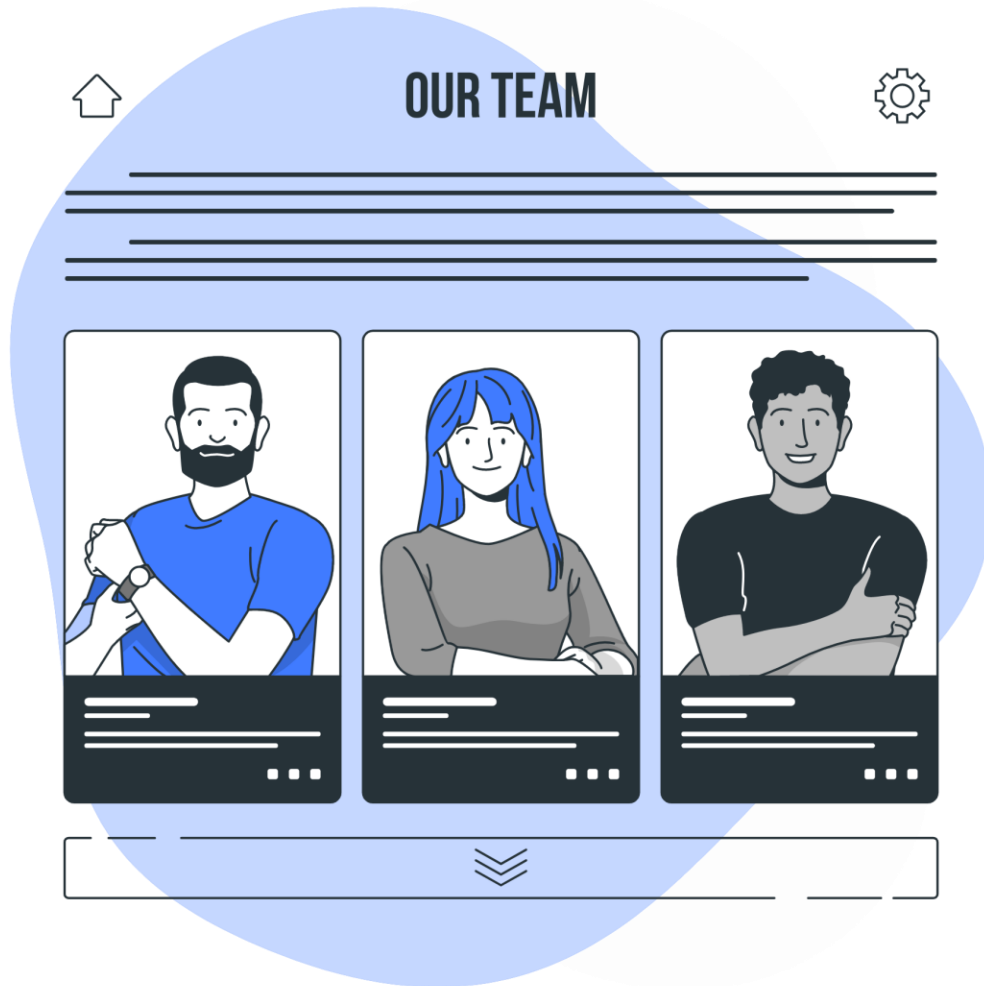


First-Year Student's Office (2D.0)

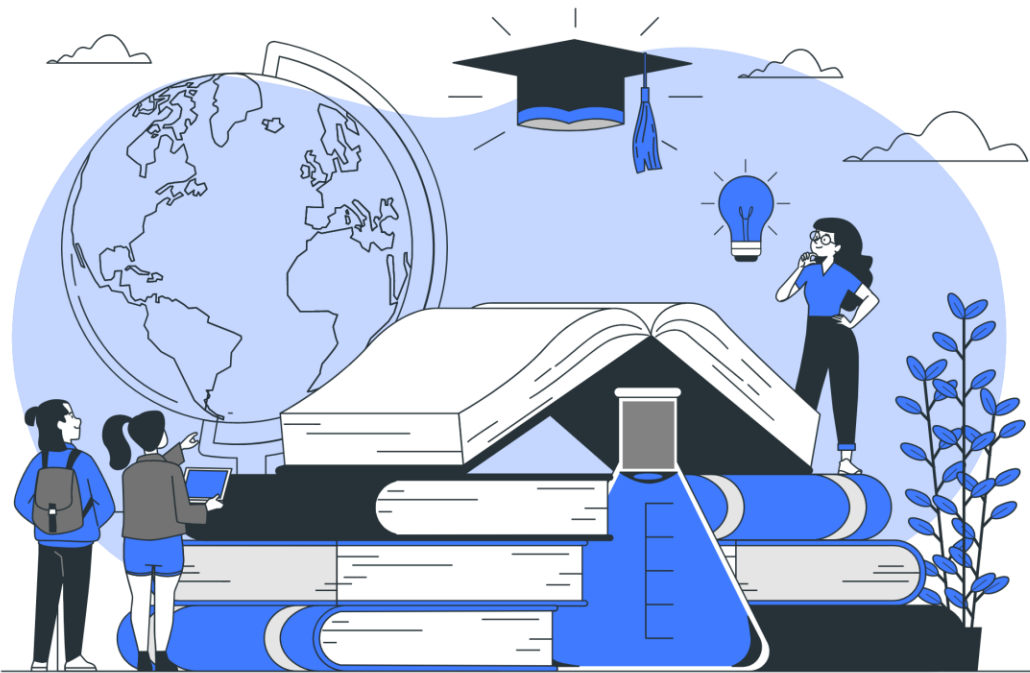

Learning Centre (6D.2)/ CLÉO (4E.10)

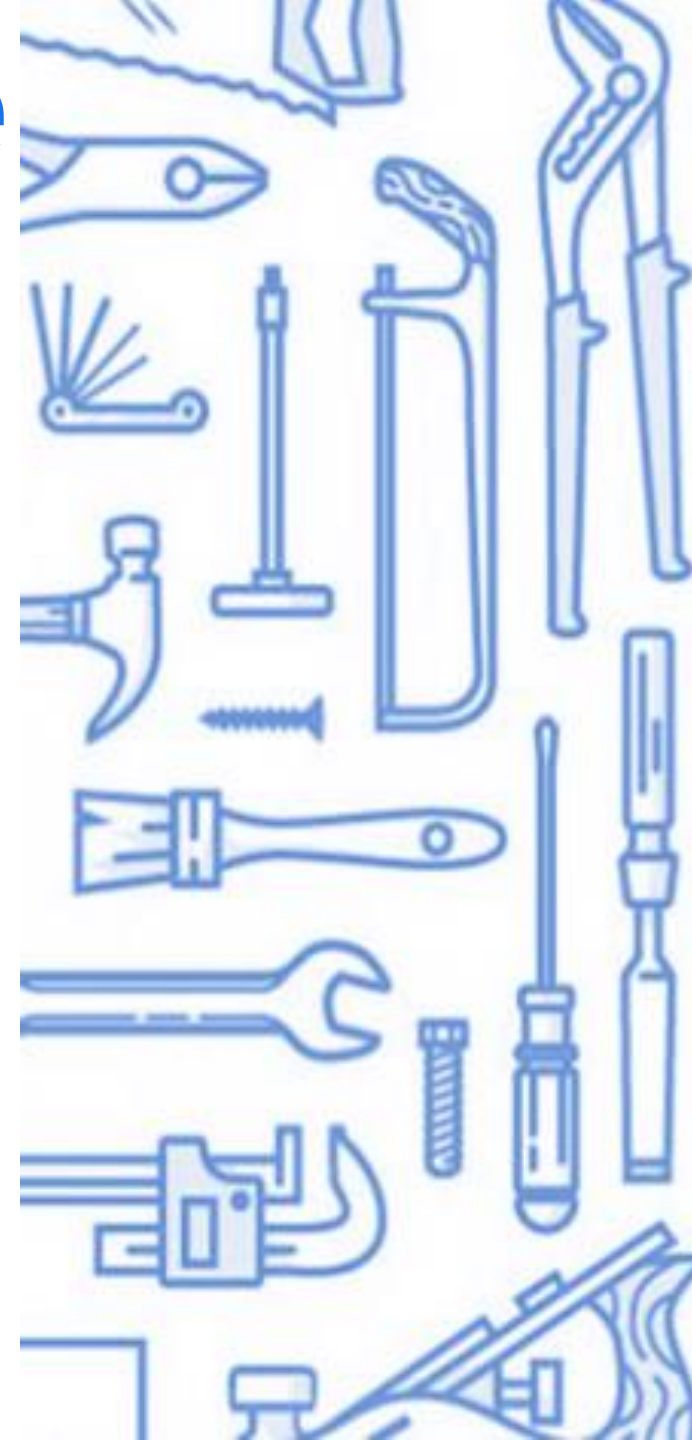
- Professionals from the Learning Centre can meet with students to support them with ESL skills, structuring essays, studying effectively, time management support...

- Other academic supports are also available: Math Success Centre, Physics Tutorial Room...

Student AccessAbility Centre (2E.6)

- Assistance with hearing, visual, or motor coordination impairments.
- Assistance with documented learning disability or chronic medical conditions, or those with temporary disabilities resulting from accidents or illness.
- Supports available: note-takers, exam accommodations, adaptive technology, liaison with faculty, etc.



Mental Health Services (4E.2)

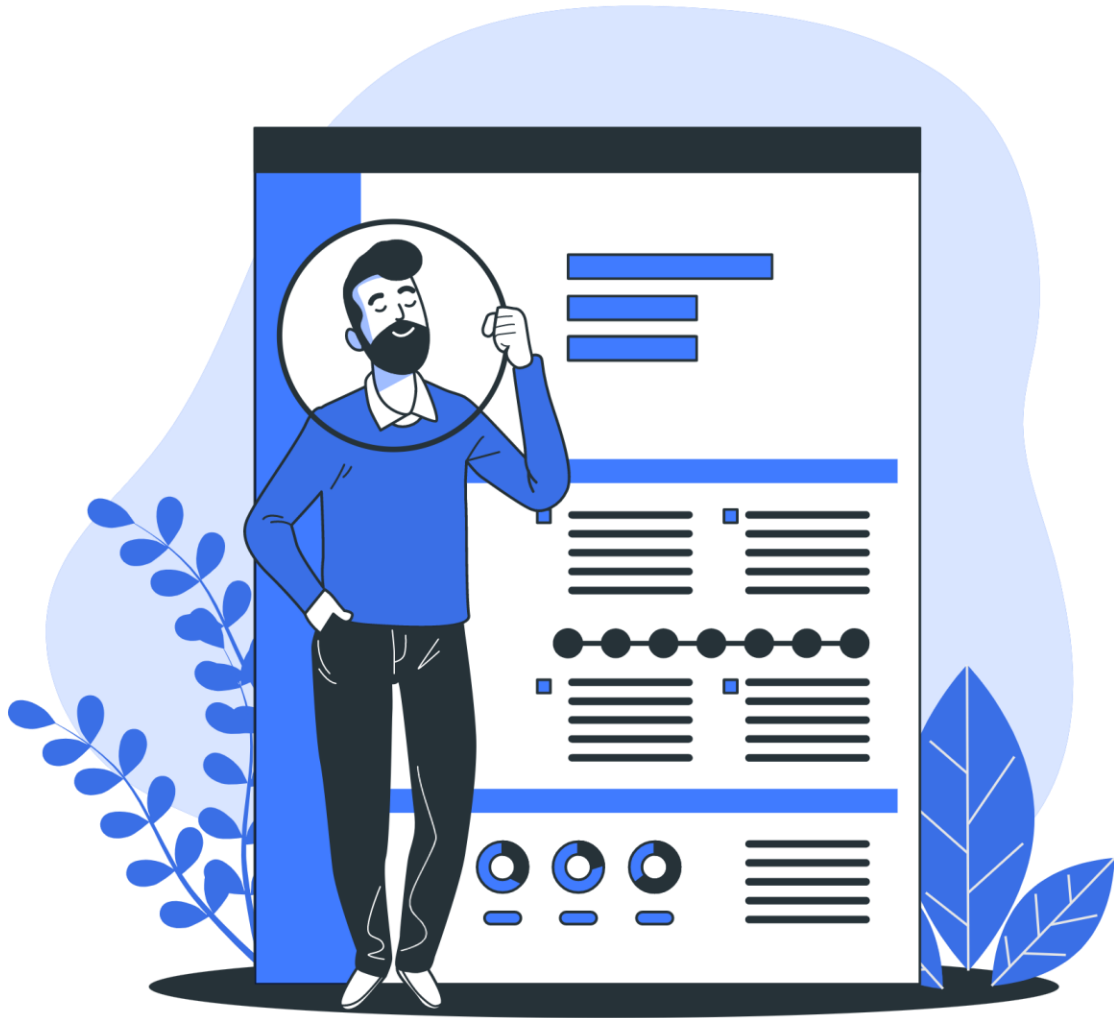


- Free, confidential personal counselling at the College.

Health Services (2D.2)



- Meet with a nurse.
- Condoms and contraceptive advice, pregnancy testing and morning after pill.
- Health and lifestyle issues (nutrition, exercise, smoking cessation).
- Appointments with a GP or gynecologist on campus.
- Must have a Medicare card.

- Career development workshops.

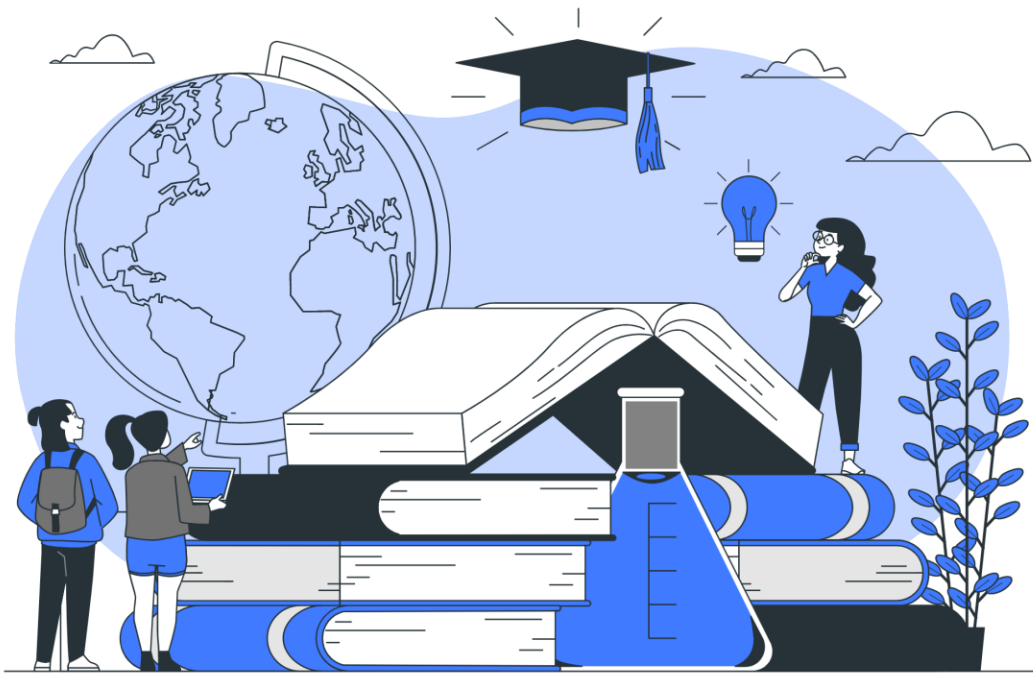
Financial Aid (4E.5)
